

Welcome our new Nurse Manager, Rikki Klusoczky

From the first minute I walked through the doors of Jocelyn House, I was greeted by friendly smiles from staff and residents who welcomed me to my new role of Nurse Manager. Transitioning to hospice after a decade specializing in an acute care setting allowed me to see that this is a healthcare facility unlike any other.

I started my nursing career in cardiac surgery and shortly after, adding in cardiac medicine as well and this was an area of nursing I absolutely loved and remained in for many years. I then pursued a career in critical care, where I completed the course and worked many years in the medical and cardiac intensive care units. During this time I was a part of an agency where I travelled rurally to several hospitals and personal care homes in Manitoba. Afterwards I spent approximately 2 years on a rehab unit, where I had the opportunity to work as a Clinical Education Facilitator teaching nursing students with the University of Manitoba. With this experience I chose to advance my career and work as Director of Health Services in a community setting. This then sparked my passion for community and palliative care, which led me to my current role where I can ensure residents are given the very best individualized care.

Upon arrival at Jocelyn House, one of the challenges

I faced was a shortage of consistent staffing among healthcare workers. This is a common issue throughout many healthcare facilities across the province. Over the last few months we have onboarded many talented and experienced hospice nurses and healthcare aides who provide the continuity of care we strive for at Jocelyn House. Along with the exceptional clinical care provided by our staff, our volunteers go above and beyond to support the needs of our residents. They provide companionship, bake treats as well as cook gourmet meals for the residents, offer haircuts and nail care, pet, music and art therapy as well as maintain the house and property.

A memory I will truly cherish is our Jocelyn House Thanking Dinner when we came together as community to enjoy a wonderful feast with the residents, their families, staff, and volunteers. The living room was converted to host 30 people and it was wonderful to witness the joy it brought to our residents and their families.

To work within a house, converted into a hospice, creates a very warm and inviting space for residents, visitors, staff and volunteers. I've seen residents in the kitchen enjoying freshly baked goods made by volunteers and sitting outside on the deck sipping their morning coffee with staff conversing with them to ensure they had everything they needed. It is such a privilege to be a part of an organization offering such a high standard of care.

I've seen how our actions, whether grand or small, make such a positive impact on the residents who live at our hospice. I am so delighted to work with the team at Jocelyn House Hospice and cannot wait to create and share more memorable experiences for our residents.

Executive Director's Report

Jocelyn House has been enhancing lives of the terminally ill for 38 years. Our home has been a safe haven for those facing end of life since 1985, when the Hutton family and its supporters opened Western Canada's first free standing hospice. Jocelyn Hutton's spirit lives on in Jocelyn House and continues to provide inspiration for our staff and volunteers, to provide quality, dignified care for our residents and their loved ones.

Although some things have changed over the years, most things at Jocelyn House remain the same; our mission, our dedication, our enthusiasm and our compassion remain unchanged and our commitment to our community is as strong as it was in 1985.

There have always been challenges to overcome, that hasn't changed. When the Hutton family embarked on the journey to open the first hospice in this part of Canada, they had a huge learning curve and countless obstacles in their path. Today, we find ourselves facing some of the same challenges as well as new ones—limited funding, increasing operational costs and staffing shortages, not to mention a pandemic. Through it all though, we've persevered. We've raised awareness of our organization, become creative and effective fundraisers, and overcome the hurdles that challenge us.

Like the founders of Jocelyn House, our team is very dedicated and proud of the work we do. The positive impact of our care can be seen every day, in all the little things we do – taking time for meaningful conversations with residents and family members, pampering someone with a manicure or baking a favourite treat.


