individual walks through the front door, and continues long after they have lived their last day at Jocelyn House Hospice (JHH). Many people think that "Hospice" is a place; however it is much more than a place, it is an approach to care focused on life, not death. Hospice care extends to family and friends, helping them care for their loved one and care for themselves as they navigate through this stage of life.

Once a resident dies, our hospice care doesn't end; we continue to support the family and friends through their loss, grief and bereavement.

Jocelyn House Hospice is much more than a healthcare facility, it is a home. JHH is a place where relationships are formed and nurtured. It is a common sight at JHH to have a family member or friend of

a former resident stop by with a donation, baked goodies, or to say hello and get a hug. At our 2019 Friends for Life Luncheon, the daughter of a former resident, Deb shared her reflections on her Mom's time at JHH. "We will be forever grateful for the opportunity to have been introduced to Jocelyn House and the warm, kind compassion that exemplifies the level of care that everyone who is associated with the House exudes. As a proud Scot, one of my Mom's wishes was to bring shortbread cookies to the house for the holidays, which she was not able to do but our family did and now carries on as an annual tradition for the house holiday party. Another gift that Jocelyn House accepted to honour our Mom was to allow us to donate one of her favourite pictures to the

house in her memory – a needlepoint poppies picture. What a delight it was for us to see her favourite picture displayed at the Celebration of Life for those who had passed."

Hospice care is a type of care and philosophy of care that addresses the individual's pain and symptoms, as well as attending to their emotional and spiritual needs. At JHH we strive to meet the unique needs of each individual resident. Whether it is time

in nature, special meals or family gatherings we make every effort to add life to their final days. One family shared their gratitude in a letter after their father's passing, "We couldn't feel more grateful that dad found his way here to you. The goals that we worked together with him to achieve in this last chapter of his life were to live with comfort, peace, security

Caring for the family once a resident has died is an integral part of the palliative care process. At JHH that process includes sharing resources for grief support, a quarterly Celebration of Life, a remembrance at the one year anniversary and ongoing support in between.

In closing her reflections at the Luncheon, Deb shared, "Like my lifelong friendships, Jocelyn House is now part of the fabric of our family mosaic and we hope to be able to continue to support their important work in our community, just like we do for each and every one of our friends because Jocelyn House truly demonstrates the power of relationships!"

the front door and feel as though I'm stepping into my home away from home.

My husband Devin and I have been together for 16 years and he's my rock. I'm forever grateful to my dad who encouraged me to go into nursing and to my mom and brothers Andre and Nigel who have always been supportive of me. As former Torontonians my family and I are huge Toronto Raptor fans and enjoy watching basketball games together.

Working in hospice can be challenging, however caring for our residents, as their nurse, in their final weeks, days and hours is forever humbling. I'm a believer that it is the little things that make a difference and we see that every day at JHH.

It's human nature to go full speed at times; working at JHH has taught me the need to slow down and enjoy the journey and those you spend that journey with. One thing in life that is guaranteed is death, and at the end of the day it's not how you died but how
