Celebrating Milestones at Jocelyn House Hospice

MOST PEOPLE DON'T THINK OF 63 AS A MILESTONE

BIRTHDAY but for Elizabeth Wotton it was exactly that! Before she moved to Jocelyn House Hospice Elizabeth was told that she would not live to celebrate her 63rd birthday on December 29, 2019 and that date became very important to her.

Elizabeth was diagnosed with cancer in 2008 and was scared that it would stop her from doing all the things she loved. However, she was determined not to let that happen and she continued to embrace life head on as she always had.

Elizabeth came to live at Jocelyn House on August 13, 2019. When she arrived she had many of the familiar items you would expect as one moves into a new home although some of her belongings are not things we typically see at Jocelyn House. She brought her bike, her sewing machine and her craft supplies and we knew immediately that Elizabeth would embrace everything that we had to offer and continue to live each moment of her life fully, and she sure did!!

Elizabeth was a generous, energetic and outgoing woman who loved people and animals of all kinds. She enjoyed volunteering at St. Leon's Garden Centre, making pencil cases for CHKV (Canadians Helping Kids in Vietnam), sewing bibs and pillow cases to donate to Children's Hospital and creating blankets and chew toys for the Winnipeg Humane Society. She loved music and nature and was a proud member of Margaret's Choir and the Manitoba Naturalists. Elizabeth certainly wasn't going to let her illness and a change of address dampen her enthusiasm for all of those activities!

Elizabeth was happiest when family and friends dropped in to visit. Crafting, games of Yahtzee, working on a thousand piece puzzle or sharing some sweet treats were some of her favourite activities in her new home. She loved to go on outings and often convinced visitors and volunteers to join her for a walk around the neighbourhood or take her down the road to St. Leon's or a local thrift shop to source materials for her projects. During the Christmas season, Elizabeth recruited anyone who entered the hospice to help her decorate three gingerbread houses to put on the fireplace mantle.

As her health declined in the weeks that followed, she continued to be surrounded by all of the love and friendship she so openly shared during her life.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

THIS YEAR marks the 35th anniversary of Jocelyn House Hospice and as we celebrate, we remember the names and faces of the hundreds of terminally ill patients who have called our hospice, home. Each brought their own unique qualities and left a lasting impression

on our staff and volunteers who had the privilege to know and care for them. As I recall some of our residents, I experience a range of emotions; awe and admiration, in remembering how so many battled courageously to live life to the fullest, for as long as they could, and joy, as I recall how humour has always been a constant and the everyday sounds of laughter. Sadness and sympathy are also emotions I experience, but mostly for the friends and family that the residents left behind. The hospice is not a sad place, it is warm and inviting, and filled with activity and lively conversation. After all, for our residents, dying occurs on one day, the rest of the time is living.

We are very proud of the work that's been done over the past 35 years and the many lives we've touched and enhanced. As

a small non-profit however, we face a number of challenges. The greatest challenge at the hospice is funding. We receive government funding that only partially covers our operating expenses, therefore leaving us with a reliance on donations from the community and proceeds from our fundraising events. Another big challenge for us is the size of our team – we are few, but mighty and work tirelessly to raise the funds necessary to provide this invaluable service for our residents.

Overseeing our organization, we have two Boards; Jocelyn House Inc. and the Jocelyn Hutton Foundation Board. Each is made up of dedicated members whose expertise and commitments, valuably support our operation.
