End of Life Living

Chessie Todd came to live at Jocelyn House Hospice in February 2020. Her family moved Chessie's belongings into her new home and cherished each moment they spent with her, aware that her time with them was precious and limited. In March of 2020, Chessie was grateful to celebrate her 95th birthday with her family, just before Covid-19 entered our lives. Her family lavished her with gifts and flowers believing it would be the last birthday they would celebrate with her. With the pandemic and its restrictions, Chessie and her family had to adapt to outdoor and online visits to maintain contact. She is now celebrating her 1 year anniversary of life at Jocelyn House, and happily looks forward to her 96th birthday in a few weeks.

Chessie was born in Poland in 1925 and immigrated to Canada with her family at 6 years old. Although she lived in St. Vital her entire adult life she didn't learn about Jocelyn House until hospice was presented as an option when it was decided that she could no longer remain on her own. Chessie was surprised how quickly Jocelyn House felt like home. She especially appreciates the homemade apple pie made by staff, a glass of wine with dinner, a manicure and hand massage in the afternoon and watching movies and sporting events with her housemates in the evening. Following the news of the spread of Covid-19 during the last year, Chessie shared that she feels so blessed to be living in a safe, warm and loving environment.

Old St. Vital is the ideal neighbourhood for a hospice because the setting is equally beautiful in each season. Chessie has had the unique opportunity to experience all the holidays in every season. Shortly after her arrival we marveled at the new growth on the trees, the birth of baby wildlife in the yard and sightings of people in kayaks and canoes passing by on the Seine River. When summer arrived Chessie enjoyed afternoon rides in the wheelchair on scenic Egerton Road followed by delicious barbequed meals on the back deck. Fall brought 2 outdoor "Covid concerts" under the canopy of gorgeous autumn leaves. The weather cooperated and the unseasonably warm fall allowed for safe visits in the sunroom well past Thanksgiving. When winter arrived we were rewarded with the sight of many people snowshoeing, skiing and walking with their kids and

dogs on the frozen river; Chessie especially enjoys watching the children sledding down the hill in the yard by the hospice.

Chessie says she has a lot to look forward to each and every day. She loves FaceTime visits with her family and appreciates the gifts they send her. She says that the little things they send remind her that she's thought of and loved. As a huge Jets fan, Chessie doesn't miss a game. One evening the game coincided with suppertime and she couldn't see the TV from the table. She and her housemate Sheila convinced the staff that it would better if the furniture in the adjoining living room was rearranged so that they could have an unobstructed view of the TV. During a commercial break the Nurse and Hospice Care Worker quickly switched the recliners with the couch, enabling a clear view and making two Jets fans very happy! Chessie remarked how kind and happy the staff at Jocelyn House are and how to her, "they feel like friends".

Chessie's life is a reminder that we don't know what lies ahead or how much time we have to live. At 95 she suggests we "Take each day as it comes and appreciate it." Good advice from a strong and peaceful woman living each day to the fullest at the end of life!

Apple Pie Filling

8 Granny Smith
Apples
2 tbsp butter
2 tbsp flour
1 tsp cinnamon
1/2 cup brown
sugar
1/3 cup
granulated sugar
1/4 cup water

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Melt the butter in a saucepan. Stir in flour to form a paste. Add water, white sugar and brown sugar, and bring to a boil. Reduce temperature and let simmer. Peel apples, cut into slices or cubes and toss with cinnamon. Place the bottom crust in your pan. Fill with apples, mounded slightly. Gently pour the sugar and butter liquid over the apples. Cover with second pie crust. Use knife to cut vents into the top crust. Bake 15 minutes in the preheated oven. Reduce the temperature to 350 degrees F and continue baking for another 35 to 45 minutes, until apples are soft.

Pastry Recipe (2 Crust Pie)
2 cups flour
1 tsp salt
2/3 cup + 2 tbsp
shortening
4-6 tbsp cold water

Whisk flour and salt together in a large bowl.

Cut in the lard with a knife or pastry blender until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Sprinkle in water, 1 tablespoon at a time, blending gently with a fork or pastry blender until all flour is moistened and dough almost cleans the sides of the bowl.


Divide the dough in half and shape flattened rounds. Wrap in plastic and refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Roll out into 2 rounds.

Sheila and Chessie recommend eating a piece for breakfast, an afternoon snack, dessert or during a Jets game with ice cream or whipping cream.

In a year during which the world was occupied by uncertainty, fear and isolation, at Jocelyn House we experienced hope, connection and generosity.
